Understanding how to change common nouns to proper nouns is also an important skill. This can be achieved by adding capital letters or using names instead of general terms. For example, "the city" could become "New York City." In passive voice, the subject receives the action, such as "A book (subject) is read (action) by her." To change active voice to passive, move the object of the sentence to the subject position and use a form of the verb "to be" with the main verb. Add the past participle form of the main verb and optionally include the agent. The formula for passive voice is [Object] + [Form of the verb "to be"] + [Past Participle] + [By + Agent (optional)]. For example, "The book was written by John." The subject of a sentence carries out the verb's action in active voice, highlighting who performs the action. In contrast, passive voice emphasizes the recipient of the action, as the subject receives the verb's action.
