Tests for R&D engine activities at car manufacturers' facilities typically use specific hardware platforms. They cater to customers who need routine emissions checks or repairs to pass inspections. * Staff is friendly and fast * Efficient service with minimal wait time * Technicians are professional, polite, and quick If a vehicle has been registered in Arizona for more than a year, the following items are required for testing: * The appropriate test fee * A key for locking gas tank (if applicable) For a retest after an initial failure, bring the original vehicle inspection report with repair information completed on the back. Before registering your vehicle in Arizona for the first time, ensure you meet these requirements: * Previous year's registration * Title or bill of sale * Vehicle is warm and air conditioner is turned off * Passengers and pets are not brought along * Trailers are removed from vehicles before entering the station property * Vehicles can enter the station on their own power * OBD vehicles must be in ready mode Additionally, prepare your vehicle by: * Using fresh fuel (tank at least ½ full) * Scheduling an oil change (deteriorated oil causes higher emissions) * Performing a tune-up (fresh spark plugs, proper timing, and RPM) * Checking the "Check Engine" light is OFF Given text: A valid driver's license, other official photo identification or a bank guarantee card is required when paying by check. Check for conveniently located stations near your home or work, and see up-to-the-minute wait times so that you aren't waiting in long lines. REMEMBER: Testing is faster weekdays from 4-5 p.m., Saturday afternoons and mid-month. VEHICLE NOT PASSING? Some vehicles qualify for emissions waivers. If your vehicle is failing the emissions test, see Waivers for more information on waivers and to see if your vehicle qualifies. WHEN YOU PASS THE TEST Once your vehicle passes the emissions test, save time and renew your registration online at azmvdnow.gov. You may also renew at an MVD or Authorized Third Party office. Pull your car into the station, put it in the park, and apply your emergency brake. If your vehicle is a manual transmission, ensure you put it in neutral.Choose where you are most comfortable waiting for the test to be completed: the waiting booth, waiting area, or outside.While you are waiting the inspector performs the On-Board Diagnostic (OBD) test — without getting into your vehicle — the inspector reaches in to connect the OBD cord to the data link connector (DLC).Once that is complete, you will be asked to return to your vehicle to turn the ignition key to the accessory position, so the inspector can verify the check engine light is functioningYou will then start your vehicle, allowing the inspector to observe that the check engine light turns off from a safe distance.After the OBD test is complete, you will turn off the vehicle and exit to the waiting area of your choice (waiting booth, waiting area, or outside).When payment is due, simply insert your credit card and remove it when processing is complete.You then return to your vehicle, and the inspector finishes the test process and delivers your vehicle information report, all while maintaining social distancing. ✓ OBD Express Lane*: Faster service for 1996 and newer gasoline vehicles with less than a 8500 gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR). *Excludes bi-fueled vehicles. ✓ Heavy Duty Trucks: * P02 - Accommodate 13' and under in height * P03 - Accommodate over 13' in height X Service not available at this Location Where can you go in Chandler to have your car emissions tested? Did you know that you can have your vehicle tested up to 90 days prior to the expiration of the current license tags? Anyone whose vehicle is due for registration renewal, and knows that it will be out of state at renewal time, may have the vehicle tested up to 90 days early. We will test vehicles anytime a person presents them for testing (perhaps you are thinking of Vehicles submitted outside of the 90-day testing window or those overdue for renewal won't be eligible for registration renewal, so please ensure any checks take place within this timeframe to avoid losing the test fee.
