This article is for people who manage Google services or devices for a company, school, or group. If you're using a personal (@gmail.com) account, go instead to the Google Account Help Center. If you have access to an administrator (or admin) account, you can sign in to the Google Admin console. The Admin console, at admin.google.com, is where admins manage Google services for people in an organization. In any web browser, go to admin.google.com. Starting from the sign-in page, enter the email address and password for your admin account (it does not end in @gmail.com). If you forgot your password, go to Reset your administrator password. An admin account has privileges to manage services for other people in your organization. The Admin console is only available when you're signed in to an admin account, get help from someone else who does. For details, go to Who is my administrator?. If you find a list of Google Accounts on the sign-in page, be sure to choose your admin account (it does not end in @gmail.com). If your company is using a single sign-on (SSO) service with your Google account, then signing in to your account from admin.google.com sends you to a second sign-in page. From here, you sign in to your Admin console and other programs or services your company has set up with SSO at the same time. Just enter the sign-in name and password your admin gave you. With Chrome Browser, you can manage your website passwords so that Chrome automatically completes the sign-in fields for you when you visit these websites. The two-step sign-in flow for all Google accounts does not impact the behavior of the password manager. Why do I sometimes need to sign in again while using the Admin console? To keep your organization's Google services secure, you need to sign in to the Admin console after each hour of use. How does enabling single sign-on (SSO) affect sign-in if I'm an administrator? If you're a super administrator and you sign in to admin.google.com with your full admin address (name@example.com) and password, you're redirected to the Admin console. Google does not redirect you to the SSO server. If you're not a super administrator and sign in at admin.google.com, you are redirected to the SSO sign-in page. Switch to another Google Ads account without signing out Click your profile image on the top right of your Google Ads account. This will show a list of the Google Ads accounts associated with your current Google account. From the list of associated accounts, select the account you want to access. If your Google Ads accounts are linked to different Google accounts, you can also access these different Google accounts, and associated Google Ads accounts without having to sign out and back in again. Sign in to multiple Google accounts Click your profile image on the top right of your Google account. Click Switch account. Enter the email address for the account, and click Next. Enter the password for the account, and click Next. Note that signing into multiple accounts doesn't merge your account data or give these accounts access to one another. After you've logged into multiple accounts in the same browser, you can click your profile image and select a different account from the list at any time. If you sign in to a Google account that isn't yet associated with a Google Ads account, you'll be directed to the Google Ads sign-up page. Sign in with an alternate email address for your Google account If you've added an alternate email address to your Google Account, you can use that alternate email address to sign in to Google Ads. Your password will be the same as the password for your primary email address. Sign in with Google button If you've never used Sign in with Google to sign in to the third-party app or service, the app or service displays a non-personalized Sign in with Google button. This button prompts you to sign in. When you do so, you grant consent to share the name, email, and profile picture on your Google Account with the third party. If you have more than one Google Account, Sign in with Google prompts you to choose which account you want to use. If your desired account doesn't appear, select Add another account. If you've previously used Sign in with Google with the third-party app or service, it displays a personalized button that shows your profile picture and email address. This button helps you remember how you last signed in to this app. Once you select the button, you can confirm the account you want to use to sign in. It then signs you into the app or service. Tip: If you have an account with a third-party app or service, you can use Sign in with Google to sign in. If you don't have an existing account with the third-party app or service, one may be automatically created for you when you use Sign in with Google. Google sign-in prompt You can sign up for or sign in to third-party apps or services easily with the Google sign-in prompt. When you go to an app or service that supports the Google sign-in prompt, a notification pops up. This notification prompts you to sign up or sign in. After you tap this, you're signed in to the third-party app or service. Automatic Sign-in Important: To use Automatic Sign-in, you must already be signed in to your Google Account and have previously granted consent to share your profile with the third party for the purpose of signing in. If you haven't granted consent to the third party, the Google sign-in prompt appears. To provide a seamless experience, Automatic Sign-in removes the manual steps to sign in when you return to an app or service. A dialog box shows the process of the sign in as it occurs. How to disable the Sign in with Google prompt Important: When you disable the Sign in with Google prompt, you disable the prompt for all third-party apps or services on all Android devices where you're signed in with your Google Account. To disable the prompt on Android: If you disable the prompt in your settings, it won't disable the prompt in your browser. Some browsers, including ITP browsers like Safari, don't allow these prompts to be disabled. To disable other browser prompts, go to your browser.
