Historically, it is part of Yorkshire West Riding. The village is located about 4 miles (6 km) east of the center of Barnsley. It is historically part of the West Riding of Yorkshire. The village is approximately 4 miles (6 km) east of Barnsley. in 2001 Darfield [1] had a population of 8,066 at the time of the UK census, and in 2011 according to census data, their number increased to 10,685 [2]. History Darfield has been excavated with Roman coins and there is evidence that the village was a Roman settlement during its history.



In the directory, the name "Feld" means "a large area of pasture" and the term "dere" refers to forest deer.

The connection is called Derefeld, which later became Darfield. There are records [where? Darfield remained an insignificant farming village until 1862Mining companies dug in the Barnsley Minen area to exploit the rich coal deposits that run through the area. BAILILD Main Colliery and Mitchell were local mines, the population of the village grew quickly and it became a source of work for the surrounding mines. In 1901 there were over 4,000 people (quoted) compared to 600 in 1851 (quoted) In June 1963, Búrfíeld had a train station on the Sheffield Leed line. The line itself was closed in 1966 due to a strong decline in production. The community transactions of Búrfíeld include a co-op supermarket, a flower shop, a bakery, a newspaper kiosk, two hairdressers, a garage/maintenance, a post office, medical records and a hardware store. Two village chemists work in the local doctor's office and in the Snape Hill Road. The gastronomic facilities include two Indian restaurants (formerly The Bridge Inn and The Station Public House), two restaurants to take away, two fish-and-chips restaurants, a Chinese restaurant to take away and a pizzeria. Four pubs remain in the village: Cross Keys, Queen Victoria, Búrfíeld and Sportsman's Inn. There are also two clubs; Village Club and conservative club. The Cricket Club also has a bar. All Saints Church, Bóngeld in Bashfield is the Maurice Dobson Museum, which is divided into four parts: the main museum, a shopping center in which locals can sell their handicrafts, a café/a gallery and a Meeting point.



[3] There is also an outdoor terrace on which some of the larger objects are exhibited. The property of the museum was donated to the village of Maurice Dobson, after which the museum is named. There is also a small public library in the village. An Anglican parish church and two methodist chapels serve the religion. Ebenezer Elliot, Corn Law Reimer, is buried on the All Saints Cemetery in Bashfield. Transport StagoCoach Yorkshire operates 15-minute bus connections according to Barnsley Interchange on lines 218, 219 and X19 during the dayEverything. Darfield is also served by the X19 Express bus service which runs direct to Don Caster Frenchgate Junction. Wombwell and Goldthorpe train stations are also within easy reach of Darfield, connecting you to Sheffield, Meadowhall, Wakefield and Leeds.
