SATs (KS2) Maths 2016 Paper 2: Reasoning contains video tutorials of all 20 questions and downloadable blank and fully completed exam papers allowing you to do your own mock exams at home including marking your own paper. 2016 was the first year of the new Key Stage 2 tests in Mathematics. These tests assessed children against a national standard and was the first test to reflect the new primary curriculum, which was introduced in 2014. This curriculum is on a par with the best education systems in the world and children are expected to achieve higher standards than before. Results in each test were reported using a scaled score. A scaled score of 100 represents the expected standard for each test. If a student gets a scaled score of 100 or more it means they are working at or above the expected standard in the subject. If a student gets a scaled score of less than 100 it means that they may need more support to reach the expected standard. A scaled score of 100 represents 60 marks out of a possible 110 on these three mathematics papers. Students should work through every question, showing clear workings as incorrect answers can still receive method marks. They should make full use of the squared paper given with some questions by writing one digit in each square. Calculators are not allowed in these KS2 tests so clear knowledge of the multiplication tables is vital, as is a clear approach to addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Students need to read the information carefully before attempting the question. Paper 1 is the Arithmetic paper and Papers 2 and 3 are Reasoning papers. Marks for both papers were added together to form the total GaPS mark. Download the question papers, answer booklets and mark schemes below: Children in Year 6 (those aged 10-11 at the time) took their KS2 SATs tests in May 2016. The 2016 KS2 SATs were authored, produced and managed by the STA (Standards and Testing Agency) under the authorisation of the DfE (Department for Education). The 2016 KS2 SATs were authored, produced and managed by the STA. KS2 SATs were taken in Maths, Reading and GaPS under formal exam conditions. These papers were marked externally whilst separate teacher assessments in Writing and Science were marked by their teachers. Pupils with additional educational needs were offered support and/or extra exam time where available. Modified materials using braille and large print were available to eligible pupils and their teachers. For the 2016 Key Stage 2 tests, it was decided that the Reading paper would again take place on the Tuesday following a successful trial in 2018. The 2016 SATs took place under exam conditions and were marked externally. 2016 was the first year of 'new-style' KS2 SATs tests under the new national curriculum. To help prepare children for the 2016 KS2 SATs, children were able to download test papers from previous years free of charge. Whilst not working to the same curriculum, KS2 SATs Papers from 2015 (and before) were still useful to aid preparation. Once marked, children's scores were converted to scaled scores: If a child's scaled score was below 100, they had not reached the expected standard. If a child's scaled score was between 100 and 109, they had reached the expected standard. Thus, the "pass mark" for pupils taking the 2016 KS2 English Reading SATs was 21/50 or 42%. In order to achieve "greater depth" (scaled score of 110) a child would have to score at least 34/50 or 68%. Thus, the "pass mark" for children taking the 2016 KS2 Maths SATs was 60/110 or 54.5%. In order to achieve "greater depth" (scaled score of 110) a child would have to score at least 98/110 or 89.1%. Thus, the "pass mark" for children taking the 2016 KS2 Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling SATs was 43/70 or 61.4%. In order to achieve "greater depth" (scaled score of 110) a child would have to score at least 61/70 or 87.1%. Individual KS2 SATs results were fed back to parents some time after this date, normally within a child's end of year report. Every school's KS2 SATs performance was made publicly available in December 2016 as part of the 2016 primary school league tables. National Curriculum Assessments are now carried out only at the end of Key Stages 1 and 2. At both key stages the process includes a combination of tests and teacher assessment judgements. The first round of assessments in the new model was undertaken in 2016. What are SATs? SATs (Standard Assessment Tests) are national tests given to children at school. They are also known as 'SATs papers', 'SATs exams' or 'SATs tests'. In primary school, children take their Key Stage 1 (KS1) SATs at the end of Year 2 and their Key Stage 2 (KS2) SATs at the end of Year 6. SATs papers are taken in English Reading, Maths and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (GaPS or SPaG). Separate SATs papers are also taken in Writing and Science though these are less formal teacher assessments. In secondary school, children take their Key Stage 3 (KS3) SATs at the end of Year 9. Children can expect tests in English Reading, Writing Maths, Science and Shakespeare. Rather than externally moderated exams, these tests are teacher assessments.
