Blood tests can be a useful tool for assessing general health and diagnosing or monitoring various conditions. However, it's essential to understand the process, potential risks, and costs involved. Before undergoing a blood test, you may have questions such as: Do I really need these tests? What are the risks? How will I get my results and when? To prepare for a blood test, check with your doctor or the pathology collection centre to see if any special preparations are required. This may include fasting, avoiding certain foods or drinks, or taking medication at specific times. In Australia, you can typically get a blood test at a pathology collection centre, which will be recommended by your doctor. Some hospitals also offer routine blood tests. Having a blood test is usually quick and easy, but there may be some waiting time at the centre. Before the test, you'll have your details checked, and then a tourniquet will be applied to your arm to stop blood flow. A needle will then be inserted into a vein, and a small amount of blood will be collected in tubes for analysis. In rare cases, you may have difficulty finding a vein or feel faint during or after the test. If you're concerned about any of these risks, let your doctor know beforehand. There are many different types of blood tests, and some may require multiple tubes of blood to be collected. Common blood tests include those to check heart health, inflammation levels, vitamin levels, hormone levels, and more. The results of most common blood tests will be available within a day or two, but some may take longer. Your doctor will let you know when your results are likely to be ready and whether they'll contact you about the result. To understand what your blood test results mean, talk to your doctor. The results will only have meaning in the context of why you had the test, your age, sex, overall health, lifestyle, treatments or medications you're taking, and any other relevant factors. Blood tests are generally accurate but can sometimes be wrong - this is known as a false positive or negative. Regardless, your doctor will consider all aspects of your health before discussing the results with you. As for costs, they vary depending on the test and whether Medicare covers it. Your doctor will explain if there's an out-of-pocket cost involved. Having your blood taken can be a nerve-racking and uncomfortable experience for many people. It's understandable that you might feel apprehensive about the process, but it's an important step in maintaining good health. There are several reasons why having your blood tested is beneficial. Using a clean alcohol swab, gently cleanse the area where you'll be pierced. A tourniquet will then be applied to your arm to aid blood collection. The phlebotomist will position the needle at a precise angle and insert it into your skin, which might cause a slight stinging sensation but shouldn't be uncomfortable. If you need a blood test, you can walk-in at SGH SOC Lab which is located at Block 3 L1, Yellow Zone from Mon - Fri: 8.00am - 5.30pm and Sat: 8.00am - 1.00pm. You do not need an appointment for the blood test. Please bring along your original laboratory investigation order form(s) provided by the clinic on the day of your visit. The number of tubes of blood to be collected depends on the number of lab tests ordered for your medical condition and you may expect 3-6 tubes of blood to be collected. You may also be advised to have your urine sample collected on the day of your visit or collect your stool/urine samples at home based on the type of lab tests ordered. Lab test investigation works are required to ascertain your medical condition and for the management of your medical needs.
