The categories divided for the students are, Primary Level (Classes 1 to V) Secondary Level (Classes VI to VIII) Higher Secondary Level (Classes IX to XII) Candidates may choose to teach in either primary or secondary school; higher secondary teaching is not a direct recruitment option (except for experienced candidates). Candidates must earn a degree in each of the different subjects—Science, English, Math, Social Studies, etc.—if they intend to pursue teaching as a vocation. Step 4 - Apply for Different Schools of your choice Candidates who pass the CTET or any other entrance exam are eligible to apply for teaching positions in the schools of their choice. Before submitting an application to a school, candidates should bear the following information in mind All categories of the CTET scorecard have a seven-year validity period following the announcement of the results. The CTET candidate is eligible to apply to schools run by the federal government (KVS, NVS, Central Tibetan Schools, etc.) as well as those in the Lakshadweep, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, and Chandigarh Union Territory (UT) administrative regions. Candidates for the CTET may also apply to independent private schools, which may take the test into consideration.
