Each task is assessed independently. The assessment of Task 2 carries more weight in marking than Task 1, so be sure to plan your time accordingly. The content of the Reading Section will differ for the Academic and General Tests. Format: The Academic Writing test is 60 minutes long and includes two tasks. Candidates are required to write at least 150 words for Task 1 and at least 250 words for Task 2. Both responses should be written in a formal style. SectionsDescription IELTS Academic Task 1You will be asked to describe some visual information (graph/table/chart/diagram) and to present the description in your own words. You may be asked to describe and explain data, describe the stages of a process, how something works, or write about an object or event. You need to write 150 words in about 20 minutes. IELTS Academic Task 2You will be presented with a point of view, argument or problem. You need to write 250 words in about 40 minutes. You will be given a task card which asks you to speak about a particular topic and includes points that you can cover in your talk. You will be given 1 minute to prepare your talk. You will then speak for 1-2 minutes. Part 3You have a longer discussion on the topic. The examiner will ask you further questions connected to the topic in Part 2.
