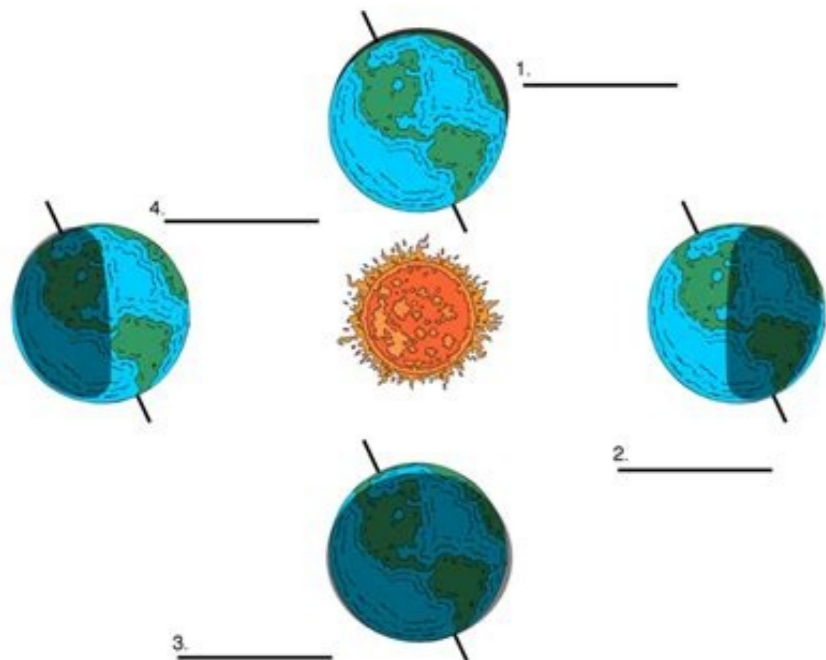

Like nature, it goes through growth, maturity, distribution and death, this is also possible for humans. The poem is based on these four seasons, each season a different scene in the human life cycle.

. He compares these seasons to the four seasons and suggests that humans and nature go through cycles of change. The formation of spring represents the youthful energy and enthusiasm of childhood, when everything seems new and exciting. The speaker describes it. The season as a time of Fancy Clear/All Beauty which indicates that the mind is open and open to new experiences. The main attraction of life is when people enjoy the fruits of their labor. The interviewer states that people are currently "hunting for luxurious/spring thoughts, cute/somber", which means they like the memories of youth and enjoy their achievements. Keats stresses that each season has its own unique beauty and value and that it's important to assess each stage of life as it arrives. The poem also shows that death is a natural part of life and we don't need to be afraid, but should be accepted as part of an inevitable part of human experience. There are four seasons in the human mind: it has its own charming spring, when it is beautifully clear, it perceives all the beauty with the luminous scale: it has its own summer when the luxurious spring rejoices in the new idea that he likes. He is closest to heaven: his soul's quiet bay his soul's fall when he closes his wings; Ideally, watch the fog - let it not be overlooked as a sill stream.

John Keats (1795-1821) was an English poet who contributed several important works to the canon of poetry in the English language. Although officially trained as a surgeon, Keats distinguishes him by touch during his time as a writer as well. He often used pictorial images that reflect his formation in the stable, as in this poem where bucolic suggestions evoke images of the countryside. This poem represents the different phases of life, such as the four seasons. However, rather than describing the physical nature of these phases, they are the seasons that exist in the human mind. He has a different perspective for every person's life. First, he saw his energetic source, where everything seems possible, and observes its beauty. A certain naivety in young people, which we think can be observed very well in the singularity; Keats embodies spring as "a vigorous emphasis on the parallelism between the season and the state of the young mind. Spring occupies only two verses of this sonnet, which also reflects the brevity of a child's vision of life. While the language used by Keats to illustrate the exposure and clarity of summer suggests a resignation from emotional closure. Keats accepts zoomorphism in order to portray the human soul as a bird that has closed its wings in autumn. Unlike a cow, the image of a bird shows the ability to convey or the ability to use greater imagination. This is consistent with the intelligent age of next adulthood and its self-testimony. Autumn gets most of the poems with four lines and emphasizes how long this mentality lasts in human life.
